

Dr. Brancaleon received a Laurea in Physics in 1991 and a Doctorate in Physics in 1996 from the Università degli Studi di Parma. He was a Postdoctoral Research Assistant at the Steacie Institute for Molecular Science in Ottawa (Canada) from 1996 to 1998, a Postdoctoral Fellow at the Wellman Laboratories for Photomedicine in Boston (MA) from 1998 to 2000, and a Researcher at the University of Dundee (Scotland) between 2003 and 2003. In 2003 he was appointed as an Assistant Professor at the University of Texas at San Antonio and in 2010 he was promoted to Associate Professor. His area of research expertise is Molecular Biophysics. He has published over 50 peer reviewed publications and seven review manuscripts. His research has been funded by the National Institutes of Health, the Department of Defense and the Burroughs Wellcome Fund. He was elected twice as a member at large of the Executive Committee of the Texas Section of the American Physical Society. He maintains collaborations with the Università degli Studi di Parma as well as with the Institut Quimic de Sarria (Barcelona). He was a contributor to the inaugural Conferenza dei Ricercatori Italiani nel Mondo in Dallas and has participated various times to the event.
